Centro de los Derechos del Migrante, Inc. (CDM) is hiring a **Worker Health Initiatives Project Coordinator** for a high-impact public health outreach project to farmworkers and protein processing workers. The project will deliver science-backed health and safety information to prevent virus transmission, promote workplace health and safety, and improve workers' access to vaccines.

### About CDM

Centro de los Derechos del Migrante, Inc. (CDM) is the first transnational migrant workers' rights organization based in Mexico to support migrant worker organizing and advocacy on both sides of the U.S.-Mexico border. Since its founding, CDM has been driven by its mission to improve the conditions of low-wage workers in the United States. With a binational, multilingual staff and geographic reach, CDM has grown over the past 15 years in response to an increasing need, but its end goal remains unchanged: to overcome the border as a barrier to justice. CDM envisions a world where migrant workers' rights are respected, and laws and policies reflect their voices. Through multilayered outreach and engagement strategies, CDM supports migrant workers to defend and protect their rights during recruitment, while at work in the U.S. and as they return to their home communities. ### Position Responsibilities

The Worker Health Initiatives Project Coordinator will oversee the success of core programmatic, contractual, and administrative aspects of CDM's Health Initiatives projects. Among other duties, the Coordinator will:

- supervise Worker Health Initiatives project staff, including a Worker Health Initiatives Assistant and teams of part-time Community Health Workers (CHWs), ensuring that they effectively develop and implement work plans to meet programmatic and administrative goals;
- help train Worker Health Initiatives staff in science-backed public health best practices and popular education and outreach methods reflecting CDM's commitments to health equity and racial justice;
- develop and strengthen trusting relationships with farmworkers' and protein processing workers' communities and allied organizations;

- coordinate with communications and outreach teams to deliver science-backed information about COVID-19 vaccines, how to prevent workplace infections and transmission, and workplace health and safety;
- support farmworkers and protein processing workers in overcoming barriers to vaccine access, combatting COVID-19 misinformation, and recognizing and helping to dismantle structural racism embedded in the US healthcare system;
- participate in regular calls with project partners and public health experts to coordinate this public health project across regions;
- manage relationships with subcontractors and consultants, including contract bids, invoicing, and billing;
- travel overnight from time to time; and
- assist in project documentation, analysis, and reporting.

### Required Qualifications

- You have an unshakeable commitment to racial, social, and economic justice and health equity;
- You are passionate about defending the rights of migrant workers, immigrants, and low-wage workers;
- You possess full professional fluency in English and Spanish;
- You have experience in coordinating and supervising teams, working with college and graduate students, and implementing complex projects;
- You have experience in public health and community education;
- You have a current, valid driver's license;
- You are willing to travel regionally, including overnight, approximately 15% of the time;
- You have supervised other people's work and given constructive feedback to support them and get projects done; and
- You have a personal connection with migrant worker communities, enabling you to establish authentic, trusting relationships.

### Salary and Benefits

CDM offers a highly competitive salary range starting at \$55,000 for Baltimore-based candidates. We offer comprehensive benefits, including generous vacation, 401(k), a Health Savings Account (HSA), and health, dental, and vision insurance for the employee and their dependents.
